

2026 PACIFIC FAIR MAGIC MILLIONS POLO & SHOWJUMPING FAQs

GENERAL

When does the event start and finish*?

General Admission gates open from **8.00am**, with Showjumping commencing from 8.30am.

Pacific Fair Pavilion opens from **11.00am** however, guests are welcome to arrive early at the event grounds with access to the General Admission area to watch the Showjumping competition until the Pacific Fair Pavilion opens at 11.00am.

Pacific Fair Fashions on the Field registration opens from 11.00am, with winners announced at approx. 2.30pm.

The Showjumping competition includes three classes. The Junior competition, the Queensland Off-The-Track Cup Final, and the Senior Teams competition. The Junior Class commences at 8.30am, with the Off-The-Track Cup Final from 10.15am, followed by the Senior Teams commencing at approx. 12 noon.

Polo games will take place between 2.45pm – 5.00pm with the day's activities concluding at 5.30pm.

The Ticketek booth at the event will be open for GA ticket sales from 8am.

Where is the event located?

Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping is located at Doug Jennings Park, Seaworld Drive, Main Beach.

Is there a dress code?

There is no formal dress code, but our stylist recommends; "For the ladies flowing dresses and wedges or sandals (heels are best left at home) and a summer hat or statement accessory can be an excellent way to finish off an outfit. For the gents a tailored shirt matched with dress shorts or chinos, together with loafers or boat shoes achieves a polished yet casual look for the day. Sunglasses are a must-have addition on the sunny Gold Coast!"

Any offensive or hateful clothing will not be permitted at the event.

Do you provide pass-outs?

Yes. Pass-outs are permitted at Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping, however you must ensure you scan your ticket at the gate on the way out to re-enter. Failure to do so will result in you not being able to re-enter the grounds.

Are my children able to attend?

Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping is a family friendly event. Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent and/or adult guardian.

What medical facilities are available?

There will be medical facilities available on site. Their tent will be located behind the main stage on the General Admission side of the field (western side).

Is there wheelchair/accessibility access available?

The event grounds are wheelchair accessible however, please keep in mind that Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping is located in a public park so the terrain can be uneven. There are accessible facilities located on both sides of the field. The Ferry from Broadwater Parklands is also wheelchair accessible.

Can I bring my own furniture?

General Admission ticket holders are welcome to bring a fold-out chair or picnic rug if they wish, however, the event does provide scattered seating (shaded and non-shaded) within the precinct and is available on a first-come first-serve basis. All other ticket holders are unable to bring any furniture with them.

Small handheld personal umbrellas are permitted to be brought into the grounds to assist with sun protection and shelter.

For a full list of what is and isn't permitted at the event please visit the event <u>Terms and Conditions</u> on the website.

Can I bring my own food and drinks?

For General Admission ticket holders, food and beverages can be purchased from cashless food truck outlets and bars on the day. Please note that General Admission ticket holders are also able to pack a picnic and bring this with you, however you are unable to bring your own beverages (hard or soft) into the event with the exception of sealed bottled water. Small blunt cheese knives will be accepted at the gate by security; however sharp knives and any glassware will be confiscated.

For the VIP Marquee and Pacific Fair Pavilion ticket holders, your ticket includes a food and beverage package offering.

Will there be EFTPOS facilities?

2026 Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping is a <u>CASHLESS</u> event. This means in order to purchase food and drinks on the day; you will need to carry a debit/credit card that you can either tap and go, or use a chip to insert for payment.

Please note: there are no ATM facilities on site.

Is there shade available?

The event provides some furniture under umbrellas including a large shade structure in the General Admission section. We cannot guarantee everyone on the ground will have access to shade so please ensure you pack sunscreen, wear a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses and be prepared. Personal small handheld umbrellas are permitted into the ground to assist with shelter/shade and protection. It is best to arrive early to have the best chance of being under shade.

What other activities are there on site?

The 2026 Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping includes a Kids Club; a FREE activity area consisting of pony rides, face painting, petting zoo, juggling acts and a magician.

TICKETING

General Admission and **Pacific Fair Pavilion** ticket holders receive an electronic ticket upon completion of their purchase online through Ticketek. You simply need to have your Ezy-ticket displayed on your phone, or printed, to be scanned to gain entry on the day. At the entrance gates you will make your way into the venue via a security check and receive your event entry wristband.

Can I purchase tickets at the gate?

YES! General Admission tickets and Pacific Fair Pavilion tickets are available at the gate on the day should the event not be sold out prior. It is strongly advised to buy online so you don't miss out, and to avoid queues on the day!

I am no longer able to attend; can I refund my tickets?

Unfortunately, ticket refunds are not available. However, you are welcome to notify the Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping office if you wish to gift the ticket to a family member or friend.

GETTING THERE

Is there a courtesy bus to the event?

YES! A courtesy coach shuttle service will loop all day from The Star Gold Coast via the Surfers Paradise Transit/Bus Terminal (Beach Road) to Doug Jennings Park for patrons to use at their convenience. The drop-off point at Doug Jennings Park is a short walk to the event entrance gates.

The shuttle service commences at 7.30am from The Star Gold Coast and will loop until the last service departs Doug Jennings Park at 6.00pm.

Ferry Service

To assist with the movement of guests on the day, there is a dedicated ferry service running between Broadwater Parklands (Southport Pier, Pontoon 6) and Doug Jennings Park.

Ferry tickets can be purchased in advance via Ticketek. Alternatively, tickets can be purchased on the day at the Pier, however it is recommended you purchase in advance to assist with the movement of guests and vessels during the busy morning period. Ticket costs are Adults \$10 return, Children \$2 return (18 and under).

The Ferry is also wheelchair accessible.

Can a driver drop me off at the event?

There is a drop-off zone at the Pacific Fair Magic Millions Polo & Showjumping for ease of traffic movement and to avoid traffic congestion on Seaworld Drive.

Please allow extra time to arrive as the roads to Doug Jennings Park from Main Beach can get very congested with holiday and event traffic.

Can I drive myself?

Very limited free parking is available adjacent to Doug Jennings Park in The Spit carpark on Seaworld Drive. We strongly suggest taking advantage of the courtesy coaches running from The Star Gold Coast and Surfers Paradise Transit/Bus Terminal. Alternatively, arrange private transfer, public transport or carpooling. **There is no public parking available within the confines of Doug Jennings Park.**

Please allow extra time to arrive as the roads to Doug Jennings Park can get very congested.
